CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW 17th MARCH 2002

Warmley Community Centre, Warmley, nr Bristol. It was a pleasure and an honour to judge this Championship show. I have always found the West of England Bull Terrier Club's shows to be really friendly and well run events and I was not disappointed on this occasion. Thank you to the Committee for their kind hospitality and to the exhibitors for their sportsmanship. For a very long time now it has been that the bitches in our breed have by far and away outshone the dogs. I was delighted to find that the quality of the dogs are catching up fast and there were at least 8 dogs present who I would have been happy to award a CC to, this must bode well for the future of the breed.

CLASS 1. SPECIAL BEGINNERS DOG

- 1. Hall's Youngwood Dancing Bear** - Heavyweight brindle, half white face, superb head and expression, good mouth, little bit down at pasterns. Deep chest with very good construction, strong quarters, good tail placement, moved fairly well, won on maturity.
- 2. Steeles'Charles Montgomery** - Large white, good profile and eye, correct mouth. Adequate front, nice topline, moved fairly well.
- 3. Burley & Evans' Mistlebrook Iron Duke.**

CLASS 2. PUPPY DOG

- 1. Godsall's Neverland Housemaster** - Quality white dog with brindle ears, lovely profile and expression, would like stronger under jaw. Straight front, deep chest, good tuck-up, correct topline, adequate quarters, moved close behind.
- 2. McCall's Samandal Jack of Diamonds** - Black brindle, adequate head, correct mouth, well balanced all through with good topline and tail placement, moved reasonably well.

CLASS 3. JUNIOR DOG

- 1. Fairhall's Fieldhall on the Rocks** - Top drawer white, strong head, lovely expression with the tiniest of eyes, ears could be better set. Very well balanced, straight front, nice cat feet, well muscled quarters, good tail placement. Moved well behind, a touch close in front.
- 2. Stephens' Seayess Khalifa** - Red/white, sweeping head, front needs to tighten, excellent bone, little long in back, strong quarters.
- 3. Malden's Little Brown Jug at Louka.**

CLASS 4. NOVICE DOG

- 1. Sanson's Dajan King of the Road** - Corky bl/br/w - Very strong head and profile slight mouth fault, Decent front and nice tight feet, short back, shapely body, moved close behind. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW.**
- 2. Skelton's Ulysses Archetype** - Chunky white with strong head and sweeping profile. Correct mouth. Front needs to tighten. Full bodied with good topline and tail placement. Moved close in front.
- 3. Cserfalvi-Young's Sanco Rock Solid.**

CLASS 5. POST GRADUATE DOG

- 1. Mill's Bullydale Lonesome Brave** - Handsome white with black ear, lovely sweeping head with really good turn. Excellent expression. Mouth a fraction off; a very square dog with a deep chest and solid topline. Lethargic shower who does not make the most of himself, must be very frustrating for his owners. Moved close both ways.
- 2. Thatcher's Javarke Black Jack of Schein** - Smart Bl/briw Very strong head with nice profile, slight mouth fault. Good deep chest and straight front. Stood square and moved fairly well.
- 3. Robert's Granack Desert Storm.**

CLASS 6. LIMIT DOG

- 1. Burn's Maxi-Million** - Upstanding white with head patch, beautiful arc to head, completely turned and well filled. Correct mouth. Passable front, deep chest, lovely reach of neck and short back. Movement could have been better. An absolute picture standing, pleased to award him RCC.
- 2. Young's Ounsdale Buffalo Bill of Bullyview** - White with long filled head with roman finish.

Correct mouth. Flowing bodylines with decent topline and good quarters. Coat needs to clear. Moved fairly well. Very close call between this dog and third place, could easily change places another time.

3. Wright's Rightstuff Rides into Town.

CLASS 7. OPENDOG

1. Fletcher's Grissebasse Charming White Devil - Ultra masculine heavyweight, strong head, with excellent profile and deep muzzle, has slight mouth fault, but his many virtues completely overrides this. Hard to fault bodywise, lovely straight front, good round bone, deep chest, strong quarters. Carrying just the right amount of weight to cover his large frame. Moved fairly well and owned the ground he stood on. A very impressive dog, delighted to award him his third CC. I believe this is the first foreign bred Bull Terrier to get made up to an English Champion. BIS.

2. Gratty & Dean's Targyt Polar Ice - Quality white with sweeping head, and filled right up. Correct mouth. Still immature, passable front, good topline. Very nice bodylines and tailset.

3. Kilpatrick's Lustyglaze Too Hot to Handle of Kilacabar..

CLASS 8- SPECIAL BEGINNERS BITCH

1. Hamilton & Hamilton's Kenmillone Black Pearl -Tri colour bitch, pleasing head nicely turned. Good front with neat feet. Fairly well balanced all through with good angulation.

2. Gunn's Pride of Anfield - Mature bitch, nicely filled head, correct mouth. Well made all through, lethargic showgirl.

3. Moorhouse's Navada's Love of Life.

CLASS 9-PUPPY BITCH

1. Burley & Evans' Mistlebrook Affray - Cobby white bitch, lovely sweeping head, completely filled. Straight front, nice feet, deep chest. Good quarters, moved fairly well.

2. Hall's Kenmillion Henderson at Cwmdulais - Eye catching brindle, strong head with excellent profile and fill, correct mouth. Front could be better, good topline. Moved close both ways but with drive. Close decision between all three placings, third being not so mature.

3. Grant's Granack Afternoon Delight

CLASS 10- JUNIOR BITCH

1. Marley's Arguside Priceless Ghoste - Top Quality white with small eye mark, beautiful filled head with good turn. Slight mouth fault. Straight front with neat feet. Correct topline and good quarters. Moved close behind and a little wide in front.

2. Membury's Warrior Princess at Mitzstaff- White bitch, adequate head, correct mouth, slightly out of coat, shade long in back, strong quarters.

CLASS 11. - NOVICE BITCH

1. Adlam & Rose's Soldream Devlin - Typy tri coloured bitch, lovely sweeping head, correct mouth. Front needs to tighten, nice body lines but could do with a touch more weight. Moved fairly well.

2. Hylands' Terjo Glen Anne - Attractive white bitch with strong head, good make and shape with strong quarters. Moved close both ways.

3. Kenillone Black Pearl.

CLASS 12- POST GRADUATE BITCH

1. Kilpatrick's Kilacabar Sweetest Taboo - First class white, in sparkling condition. Strong filled head, correct mouth. Straight front and neat feet. Deep rib cage, with good fore-chest. Good angulation and tail placement. Really well balanced and beautifulilly put together, moved fairly well. RCC.

2. Graham's Debully Dancing Princess - Very pretty white with head marking. Lovely head, filled and turned, slight mouth fault. Passable front, deep chest. Nicely balanced with good body lines and strong quarters. Movement hard to assess as she just would'nt settle. Tough Class, could easily change places with 3 who was out of coat.
