Special Beginners Dog

(1) Hutching's Terrakular Titian. Solid Bl/br, just a year old and mature for his age. Strong head, good finish, correct mouth. Barrell ribs, powerful quarters, moved well. (2) Ley's Working Class Hero. Lacks power in head but excellent eye and expression. Very well made if rather immature in body. Moved well. (3) Jones' Scrumpy Jack

Puppy Dog.

An excellent class. (1) Wood's Blazing Storm at Bullywood. Rich brindle with the, alas now rare, classical ('Romany') marking. Head filled and turned, excellent mouth, plenty of bone. Moved well for a big baby, a shade close behind. (2) Labonby's Bilston Black Jack of Emred. 10 mth Tri, (1) hard. Smaller but very corky, super head, short back and enough bone for his size, cat feet. (3) Rowden's Mitzstaff Lord of the Ring

Junior Dog.

Another high quality class. (1) Aherne's Conreniam King of Thieves. Just out of puppy. Very smart splash-marked B1/br (but the standard only requires 'colour to predominate'). Strong head super profile, correct mouth, cat feet. Moved true both ways. (2) Farrar and Grady's Galleries Njinsky Man. 16 mnth, bright red, smart and typy, pushing hard. Excellent head, mouth and expression. Short back, a shade upright in shoulder, showed flat out. (3) Williams' Gwynsel Its Not Unusual

Novice Dog.

McInnes and Rossiter's Kenmillto Dark Prince. Heavyweight B1/br, strong head, slight break in profile but a good turn. Reachy neck, short back, strong quarters, showed well. I heard afterwards that he came from Welfare, a great tribute to the care he received there and from his new owner. Richards' Ybrad Simply Red. Showy bright red, almost 5 years old. Filled head, punishing eye, correct mouth. Less raunchy neck than, but short back, well-bent stifles and neat feet. Roberts' The Matador

Post Graduate Dog

Ogden and Barber's Arrenbull Fin Mac Cumhall. Very high-class white. Head strong but unexaggerated, super mouth, reachy neck, ramod front. A well constructed dog that has moved accordingly. Show ingles than his usual sparkle today. (2) Smalley's Briden Carbon Copy. A close decision. Bl/Br. Beautiful head, perfect mouth, not quite the keen eye of (1) and just a shade longer in back. Shapely and well made, moved true both ways (3) Brooks' Kellouacy The Patriot.

Limit Dog.

(1) Mellor's. Bechamp Pilot At Credetta. Alone. Smart and typy white showing flat out. Powerful head, wicked eye, good mouth, correct topline. A shade more power in quarters would complete the picture but, at 19 months, he has time on his side.

Open Dog.

What a class! I needed several more tickets (1) Shaw's CH Penbray Play To The Devil. He entered the ring and dominated it, a superb blend of elegance and masculinity. Tremendous head, perfect mouth, punishing expression. His raunchy neck flows into well-laid shoulders and a correct topline. A strong, angulated rear provides drive on the move. CC and BIS (2) Gratty and Dean's Targyt Polar Ice. A dog I have always admired, unlucky to meet (1). Top-class white, his head is a real 'egg' with tiny eye and correct mouth. Barrell

ribs and strong quarters. Expertly handled, he moved parallel behind, a shade wide in front Res CC (3) Kersey's Kalsar Sweet William.

Special Beginners Bitch

(1) Shearman's Shacadia Paprika. Well-marked red smut, not big but well made. Feminine head, keen eye, correct mouth. Moved well. (2) Lindquist and Robinson's Terrakuler Geordie Girl. Br/br, not very happy today. Excellent profile, kind eye, under jaw could be stronger. She has some of the best feet seen today. (3) Sheehy's Innys Pride

Puppy Bitch.

(1) Probert's Llanwens Love Actually. Really beautiful 10 mth white, only maturity kept her from a serious place in the challenge. Feminine head, filled right up, with good roman finish, super mouth and wicked eye. Built on elegant lines, with a short back, she moved true coming and going. One to watch. BP (2) Jenkins and Goldsworthy's Innys Pride. 10 mth rich brindle, a really gorgeous colour. A chunky baby with lots of bone, showed well. (3) Sheehy's Afanbull Murcy Milly.

Junior Bitch

(1) Hill's Ireland Dream Girl At BullyBully. Very elegant white, feminine head, wicked eye, super neck, well-bent stifles and correct topline . Very well presented and handled, she moved better in front than behind. (2) Roache's Helizar Miss Adelaide. Attractive brindle, excellent head, correct mouth, eye a shade kind. Good bone for her size, big ribs and strong quarters, moved well. (3) Linacre's Yendorian Minnie The Moocher.

Novice Bitch

(1) Farrar and Grady's Gillarias Ashkalani. White, a big girl but not doggy. Filled head, wicked expression, elegant neck and excellent topline. (2) Brooks' Kellouacy Lippy Check. Bl/br, heavyweight but not unfeminine, in gleaming condition. Strong head, eye slightly kind, ears rather wide set. Lots of bone and big ribs. (3) Sainsbry's Milster Aphrodites Desire.

Postgraduate Bitch

(1)Furneaux and Turner's Dajan Class Act At Gamepoint. White puppy, sweeping profile, tiny eye, correct mouth, a little lacking in under jaw. She has beautiful neck but is a shade straight behind and her quarters need to develop. At only 11 mth, time is on her side. Expertly handed but not sparkling today. (2) Gilbert's Icacia Girlie Girl. Rich brindle, just out of puppy. Strong head with wicked eye. Lots of bone and very well constructed. (3) Mathias' Capstar Fire and Faith.

Limit Bitch.

(1) O'Neills Helizar Lady Luck At Kholander. Very smart compact white, strong unexaggerated head, keen expression, deep roomy under jaw, correct mouth. Lovely reach of neck, firm topline and just the right amount of bone her size. Movement parallel coming a shade close going press the CC winner very hard. Res CC. (2) Jefferies Bulbrum Porcelain Queen. Big feminine white with flowing lines. Not the head strength of (1) but keen eye and correct mouth. Beautiful neck and shoulders, fails a little in quarters. (3) Newberry and Gates' Kiss The Stars Over Kilabar.

Open Bitch

(1) Welsby's Bullywood Babycham at Sherrywells. Very smart, showy white, not big but with just the right amount of bone for her size. Head filled right up and turned, bite correct, canines tight. Very shapely body, short back, ramrod front. Moved tune. Well presented and handled. CC. 92) Gratty's Targyt Dusky Dawn At Dodecote. Compact, well-marked brindle, shapely and smart. Good profile and finish, beautiful mouth, short back, good spring rib. Moved well both ways, showing great rapport with her handler. (3) Morgans' Romagna Memphis Belle.
